POLICY STATEMENT

At Alliance, damage prevention is a core value and is never compromised. The commitment to implementing a robust damage prevention program will help ensure the protection of the public, our employee-partners and contractors, property and the environment.

Alliance Pipeline is committed to:

- ▶ Conducting hazard assessments to identify, and where possible mitigate, specific hazards, potential hazards, risks and consequences of damage to Alliance Pipeline's facilities;
- ▶ Holding employee-partners and contractors accountable for ensuring damage prevention program practices are followed, and to measuring employees' and contractors' performance regularly;
- ▶ Training all employee-partners involved in damage prevention on how to successfully perform their specific job function and making sure they have an understanding of applicable regulations and compliance expectations;
- ▶ Maintaining a public awareness plan that is designed to inform, educate, promote and enhance the awareness of Alliance Pipeline's external stakeholders regarding the presence of its buried facilities, and through such awareness promoting appropriate damage prevention behaviors;
- ▶ Promoting and directing all potential excavators to use the One Call services within their jurisdictions and obey the markings and directions of Alliance Pipeline in relation to their activities;
- ▶ Working collaboratively with industry peers, associations and organizations to harmonize, share and enhance damage prevention efforts designed to enhance stakeholders' understanding;
- ▶ Proactively promoting regulatory and legislative change that will enhance and strengthen the protection of Alliance Pipeline's buried facilities;
- ▶ Ensuring all unauthorized activities are reported, investigated and actioned to prevent future reoccurrences by the party that conducted the unauthorized activity;
- ▶ Striving for continuous improvement by regularly reviewing program effectiveness and by assessing newly identified threats and risks to determine any need for program modifications.
